5C Common report:

The Common is still very wet. The Purleygig stream has eroded a channel on the Chilbolton side of the Purleygig bridge affecting the Test Way Long distance footpath. This carrier is still over-topping its banks downstream of the Purleygig bridge.

Water also flows across the Test Way on the Chilbolton side of the Long Bridge. Access to the Long distance Test Way bridle way is difficult

The paths are all severely poached by walkers.

Tankering continues from the pumping station on Village Street but no further plans to overpump into the river have been announced by Southern Water.

It has been impossible (because impassable) to do any serious management.

To have water still lying in the depressions and low areas of the Common at the end of April is unknown until this year.

1. Purleygig bridge plan

MG has been unable to talk about the plan with HCC (see 2 below)

2.Meeting with Andy Blincow Wessex River Trust and David Griffiths 29th April

Subject to confirmation email Andy proposed:

- 1. that SRT would rake the gravel up to the bank upstream of the Purleygig when river flows subside
- 2. He confirmed that HCC were consultees in the plans to restore the river in 2022
- 3. that he would contact HCC re the bridge project
- 4. The WRT would, when river flows reduce take away the temporary fences and cut the poles to water level leaving some as perches. (Stonechats seen doing just that soon after)
- 5. He confirmed that the new berms were being colonised by new plants
- 6. He confirmed that the situation on the Common is the same as all rivers on the south currently

Tree fall in river

With the help of heavy machinery Andy Smith managed to pull a large fallen tree out and saw it up. Many thanks to him. The tree was causing the river to back up, waterlogging the footpath and threatening the cottages.

Azolla fern infestation

I have had a contact from Karl Dean of the Wessex Rivers Trust asking about our experience with Azolla fern . This is an Invasive Non – Native Species (INNS) which can block waterways.

This was removed from the Purleygig stream in 2022 using weevils. He was interested to know how successful the treatment has been and will keep an eye on the water (when the river flows reduce).

My view is that it won't like the roaring flood we have now.
