5. Chairman's Report

COSC Chairman's Up-date for CPC

- 1. Matters arising
- b) the barrier has been replaced by HCC. It is positioned blocking the gate onto West Down.
- c) Whitelands Path. I have contacted HCC by email to obtain their assurance that our agreement still stands i.e. HCC will provide the labour and we will provide the materials.
- d) Common tracks. I have yet to hear from JG as to a better solution to repairing them.
- e) I have not yet walked the Brockley Warren Path. I will do so when I get back from holiday.
- 2. COSC draft minutes.
- C) i. The repair to the path at the Purleygigg Bridge is working. There is no water overflowing the path despite the rain. NE have replied to my email but have not said what if any action it proses to take. In my view the repair in no way damages the SSSI and we should prepare a document recording our stance. I will raise this at the next meeting of COSC.

ii Autumn cut. Has been completed and a reasonable job done. The lateness of the cut meant that the cattle did not have a chance to eat the arisings. No invoice yet.

vi. The path leading from the village to the Purleygigg Bridge is very muddy with a deep puddle. The surrounding area is being damaged as people avoid this puddle. I have received complaints. It needs repairing. I have spoken to Andy Bond and the easiest way is to simply fill the hole with gravel. There are other less serious dips in the path that should be filled in at the same time. HCC are responsible for the upkeep as the path is part of the Test Way. I have made an offer to HCC that if they provide the labour we will provide the gravel. I think this is reasonable. I have had no response yet. Again, I don't see this as damaging the SSSI so there no reason to get NE's prior approval.

- H) i. West Down: I have emailed TVBC about using one of their volunteers groups. No reply yet.
- ii. HCV attended on 18/1. Only about 6 of them and no brush cutter just loppers. At my request they cleared an area on the slope leading down to Coley Lane. More remains to be done on this slope. The existence of numerous ant hills makes the use of a large machine impractical. Brush cutting or lopping by hand necessary. Rick Nightingale begins cutting the enclosed area with a suitable machine as per our agreement with him. His estimate is two days. I think it will probably take longer.

Tomorrow, Rob West of Vespa begins cutting the area outside the enclosure as per our agreement with him.

A bit of the fence surrounding the enclosure needs repair according to Max, the grazier. I have asked Simon Martin to take a look and quote.

For your information part if the enclosed area on West Down is classed as a SINC (Site of Importance for Nature Conservation). Hence the grant.

2 The path to the Purleygig is being damaged and widened as people try to avoid the puddles. Cllr Griffiths has a quote from Andy Bond to put gravel along the path to stop people damaging the sward. Machine & Tool Hire £395.00 Labour £300.00 materials.

David has been in touch with Daisy Cameron, Reserves Officer, Community and Leisure TVBC about The Anton River Conservation Association (TARCA) and received a very positive reply re volunteer groups to assist with management at the two sites we manage. They will be considering it at their next meeting.

Higher Tier Countryside Stewardship

Report from David Hall re the meeting with James Waddington of Savils written 23rd January 2025

I have just had a very good meeting with James Waddington at Savills and have got my head around our existing Environmental Stewardship agreements and options going forward. Could you let me know your thoughts on the following points and whether they match your understanding before we update COSC and the PC please?

Cow Common

Currently a combined Higher Level/Entry Level Stewardship Agreement running to 2028. NB Neither James nor I have a copy of the latest agreement (Gill – can you help?).

- Annual amount £4772.50 (from original 2009 agreement). Latest documentation needs to be checked and these figures updated.
- Annual claim to be submitted by 15/5/2025
- We propose to apply for Higher Tier Stewardship Agreement but the process is driven by DEFRA/Rural Payments Agency and it is unclear whether this can be done before the expiry of the current agreement in 2028.
- Both CPC and James will seek to clarify our options and bring pressure to bear to expedite this if we can before the annual claim submission in May.

- Savills can support the application process for HTS chargeable to PC after expiry of the subsidised support in February.
- COSC to seek a view from Natural England (Alison Graham-Smith) to see if they are supportive and can help move this forward.

West Down

Already a Higher Tier Stewardship Agreement running to 2026. I have a copy of the latest agreement.

- Annual amount £3878. Latest payment should have been received in December.
- Annual claim to be submitted by 15/5/2025
- We need access to the RPA Portal to manage claims (Gill/David)

I replied the same day:

Hello David

thank you for copying me in. As far as I can see your notes are right. I havent had much to do with the admin as Mandy has always done that.

I do have a copy of the Common agreement which was extended after 2019 the original finish date. I also have the doc which specifies the importance etc of the Common. I have also extracted some info from the govt website and put it on a doc .

6) Tree Report

Tree Report January 2025

- 1. Items from December in red remain current.
 - Ivy Down Farm entrance there is a group of Ash level with the electric barrier on the drive to Ivy Down Farm they show signs of dieback distress and will be monitored.
 - Joys Lane there are a number of trees on both sides of the lane just before the cattle grid heavily ivy infested showing signs of stress/death and leaning over the road rooted in some cases on the edge of the ditch they are of concern.
 - Frog Lane there are a number of mature Ash along the full length of the footpath on Frog Lane that show signs of stress/death. To be monitored and again some heavily infested with ivy. A number of these have since been blown down and dealt with there are still some to monitor.
- 2. There are a number of limbs overhanging the rear door/car park area of Jaspers cottage on The Common, these are showing signs of dieback and recommend they be removed to avoid issues of limbs falling on vehicles parked beneath. Suggested cost = £86.00
